### Attendance - a message from Mrs Galletly

I am writing to clear up a misunderstanding that has been circulating around the village and beyond, through Facebook, regarding the fixed penalty fines that some parents have received having taken their children out of school for a holiday.

I am **legally bound** to inform the Attendance Support and Enforcement Officer of absences that meet the legal intervention criteria. Whether to issue a fixed penalty fine or not is determined by the court officer. None of the fine is received by the school. I have to report upon attendance to the Local Authority, governors and DNEAT at least once a term and am required to explain what is being done to improve attendance with reference to individuals who have a high proportion of unauthorised absences. I am only permitted to authorise absences for **exceptional circumstances** and holidays do not fall into that category. Whilst we all accept that holidays are quality family times that will often include educational visits, I am not permitted by law, to authorise them in school time.

Obviously our pupils spend more hours of each day with their families than they do in school, so it is essential that we work together on the children's learning. This is why staff have always been very pleased to see so many parents at our open evenings/afternoons, parent teacher consultations and recently at Mundford Junction and Celebration Assemblies. There is no doubt in my mind that the parents of Mundford take the education of their children very seriously.

I hope that we can continue to count on your support and those of you who had not fully understood the legal position, now recognise that the recent derogatory comments about me on social networking sites were extremely insulting and unjust.
