Dear parents/guardians,

As children will be receiving their first 'behaviour scores' tomorrow, we wanted to remind you about how these work. The weekly behaviour report card was introduced a few years ago in response to parental feedback. It gives a summary of your child's behaviour this week, taking into account their attitude to learning and engagement, as well as their conduct.

A score of 1 is what is expected. This means the child has shown the school values, joined in with learning, listened, followed instructions and obeyed rules (as appropriate to their age and understanding). Further details are on the back of the child's score card.

Although all classes follow the same scoring system, what is considered 'expected behaviour' does also change with age. What might be considered expected for a pupil in Reception might be inappropriate for a Year 6! Likewise, classroom rules, behaviour and work expectations increase slightly each year.

Teachers discuss the behaviour scores with the children, so your child should understand why they have got a particular score. However, if you have any concerns, please arrange to speak to the class teacher.

The children have all made a brilliant start to the term, so I am looking forward to lots of 1s tomorrow. I hope you will praise them for their efforts too!
