Thank you to everyone that completed the parent questionnaire regarding Maths. It is great that so many of the children are doing some form of Maths at home regularly and we are also really pleased that you have noticed a difference in your child's Maths since we introduced the Maths Meetings.

This includes the long term plan which shows what children are taught in every year group, as well as the Maths Essentials for every year group. In September you will also get sent more specific information about what each class and year group are focussing on in Maths Meetings.

#### Homework

Some of you like the online resources; others would like more 'paper' homework sent home. In order to try and meet everyone's needs over the summer all children will continue to be able to use Maths Garden and Purple Mash — our online resources. Please speak to your child's class teacher if your child needs their log-in details. In addition, your child will be bringing home tonight a booklet of ideas for keeping Maths skills ticking over while on holiday. In September, teachers will explain their homework expectations for each class and we will look at ways of incorporating more Maths into these.

# September

As part of my plan for improvement across the Federation we will be looking at the way lessons and subjects are planned, introduced and taught. On Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> September (PD day) the staff from the Federation will be having training on Philosophy for Children (P4C). This approach to learning has a proven track record for improving thinking skills, which in turn has led to a marked improvement in children's reasoning and comprehension in schools that use it. This way of learning also has positive effects on the children's social and emotional development.

Philosophy for children puts enquiry at the heart of the education process. The questions that are asked are much more open, allowing children to become more confident in expressing their puzzlements and in developing their interests. As well as questioning it is equally important to develop children's skills of reasoning and reflection, both public and private. These bring into play, among other things, the thoughtful expression of emotions. The process challenges children intellectually, socially and emotionally. It encourages open - mindedness and creates conditions for change both for individuals and for communities.

More information about our new approach will be given throughout the Autumn term as our training develops.
