There will be a range of revision games and activities for the children to do as they arrive, as well as time for them to talk to their teachers about anything that is worrying them. All Year 6s should aim to be in class by 8:45am so we can get a prompt start on our revision. Thank you

Lost Property

Once again, we have an amazing array of items that the children have left around school. These have been out on the playground today and all classes have had a chance to check for things that belong to them. If your child has lost something, your last chance to claim it will be the first week back after Easter - please ask at reception. After that, everything that is left will be either kept as school spares or donated to charity

#### Good to Be Green

We are really pleased with our new behaviour system and are proud to report that the vast majority of our children are 'good to be green' most of the time. We wanted to make it clear that children who receive repeated red cards are not only at risk of a school exclusion, but will also be excluded from school events such as: school trips, after-school clubs, school disco, school sports teams. Whenever a child receives a red card, the class teacher talks to the parents about how to help the child with their behaviour. However, if their behaviour does not improve then they will lose these privileges until they can show that they can behave in a way that does not spoil it for other children. A reminder of the behaviour levels and consequences is included at the end of this newsletter.

Premier Sports - After-School & Holiday Clubs

Both our after-school and holiday sports clubs are paid for out of the school's sports premium so that there is no cost to you. Places are booked online on a first-come-first-serve basis. Our Easter Holiday club runs from 8<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> April. 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#### **Behaviour & Sanctions**

To try and ensure consistency, children and staff have agreed the following guidelines.

Silver Award	Reward
Helping others (above & beyond our whole school expectation to show kindness, e.g. giving up their own time & without being asked).	Children receive a silver reward card in the behaviour chart and a house point.
Extra work/homework outside of lessons.	
Motivating or setting a good example to others in group work.	
Editing, checking work and making a significant improvement in work or learning.	

Gold Award	Reward
Trying your best and putting extra effort into your learning (e.g. extending yourself, extra practice, perseverance & resilience).	Children receive a gold reward card in the behaviour chart, three house points and a certificate in sharing assembly.
Making a difference around the school.	

Level 1: Stop & Think	Range of Possible Sanctions
Not listening/paying attention, talking when	Informal gesture: eye contact, frown, pointing etc.
someone else is talking or shouting out.	Moving the child to a different seat.
Fiddling or making distracting noise, faces or gestures.	Prompt card on their table.
Not getting on with work.	Verbal prompt – reminding them of the behaviour

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Level 2: Yellow Warning Card	Range of Possible Sanctions
Persistent or repeated level 1 behaviours.  Shouting at someone.  Throwing small objects (e.g. rubbers).  Being disrespectful or unkind towards adults or children (this includes name-calling, deliberately hurting other's feelings, rudeness, pulling faces).  Lying.  Drawing on others work/minor damage.  Not completing your work.  Not looking after school property.	5 minutes off playtime or lunchtime. This time may be used for: Repetition of the task or completion of the work. Completing a behaviour reflection sheet. Writing an apology. Discussing their behaviour with an adult. Moved to work at the class reflection table. If during playtime: 5minutes 'time out' with an adult or sent in to behaviour recovery.
Level 3: Red Card	Range of Possible Sanctions
Persistent repeated Level 2 behaviours.  Deliberately hurting others (including throwing things at other people).  Fighting.  Stealing.  Spitting at others.  Swearing.  Threatening others.  Bullying.	Parents informed – meeting with class teacher to discuss.  Loss of whole playtime or lunchtimes (time used to make amends: redoing work, apology, repairing property etc.).  Recorded in behaviour book.  Reported to Head.  Repeat red cards will result in loss of privileges including school trips, sports clubs, sports teams and discos.

Level 4	Range of Possible Sanctions
Persistent repeated Level 3 behaviours.	Meeting with parents and Head with follow-up
Physical or violent assault causing injury, or persistent violent behaviour.	letter sent home.
Sexualised behaviour or assault.	Temporary exclusion.
Serious damage to property (e.g. vandalism).	Lunchtime exclusion.
Carrying a weapon with intention to wound.	Permanent exclusion.
Persistent bullying, including homophonic, racist, threats and abuse.	
Carrying, supplying or abusing drugs.
