Children in Need – Friday 15th November

The school council have requested a non-uniform day to celebrate Children in Need. Their chosen theme is: **dress in your favourite colour**. All children are invited to attend school that day in clothing of their favourite colour and we will collect donations to send to the Children in Need appeal. As always, please ensure the children are dressed sensibly for a day at school. They will still need to wear their indoor shoes in the classroom and change when they go outside.

Spellings

As I am sure you are aware, testing the children on a set of spellings once a week helps the children to learn some new words, but does not embed these spellings in the context in which they should be used. Often the children will forget the spelling of these words when required to use them in their independent writing. We have also noticed that the children are regularly misspelling high frequency words and not applying the spelling rules and sounds taught in their own writing.

In addition we have received feedback from parents with regards to spelling lists being sent home with words which are too easy for the children. With this in mind we are changing the way that we teach and test spellings. All children in Key Stage 2 now have a daily spelling session, just like all our younger pupils have a daily phonics session. Each week this will focus on a spelling different rule or letter pattern. Rather than a list of words to learn, teachers will instead send home the rule or pattern with some example words. These can be practised at home. If they seem too easy, then remember that the children need to be able to use them in writing – not just spell them on their own.

At school, instead of a weekly spelling test, children will be given a dictation on a Friday. This involves asking them to write a sentence or a short passage which will contain some of the spellings from that week, as well as spelling rules and patterns that have been previously taught.

If you have any questions about how to further help your child, please speak to their class teacher.
