artefact	<i>noun</i> An object made by a human being that is historically or culturally interesting.		<p>1,800BC  The first copper mines are dug.</p> <p>1,200-800BC  Metal tools are made and used.</p> <p>1,200-800BC  Tribal Kingdoms and celtic culture.</p>
era	<i>noun</i> A period of time covering many years.		<p>IRON AGE</p> <p>800-700BC  The first hill forts are made.</p> <p>700-500BC  Iron is used a lot more than before.</p>
hunter-gatherer	<i>noun</i> A person who lived in the stone age and met their needs by hunting, fishing and gathering plants.		<p>100BC  Coins are made and used for the first time.</p> <p>AD43  The Romans invade Britain - Iron Age ends.</p>
monument	<i>noun</i> Something built, usually of stone, a long time ago and is regarded as an important part of a country's history.		
neolithic	<i>adjective</i> Is used to describe things relating to the period when people had started farming but still used stone for making weapons and tools.		
prehistory	<i>noun</i> The time in history before any information was written down.		
settlement	<i>noun</i> A place where people have come to live and have built homes.
