Arithmetic: Practise adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals.


Please make sure you are reading daily, for at least 20 minutes.


L.O: To recall the names and properties of shapes.

If you have time you could write and perform this as a news programme.




L.O: To practise the chords Dm, C7 and G7.
