

Write some sentences about the picture.



Can you practice your letter formation and remember the sounds you have learnt so far?


English – Revising verbs.



Today I would you like you to practise verbs by playing charades. Write down a selection of verbs on small pieces of paper. Fold them up and place them in a container. Then take turns with a family member to act out the verb (remember you can not talk!) Have Fun!



Maths – Division.



Today I would like you to gather some objects, this may be your toys, teddies or dolls. Count how many objects you have them see how many ways you can share them equally. Can you record your investigations as a number sentence?

For example 15 teddies shared into 3 equal groups equals 5. Now can you find out what happens if you share 15 into 3 equal groups? What do you notice?
