This week Elm Class had an exciting No Plan Day in the forest. They had to use a range of reading, maths and problem-solving skills to complete an outdoor escape room, then they created bug hotels for the wildlife. Rowan Class had a SAW Day (Science-Art-Writing) exploring magnetism, with lots of 'wow' moments when they discovered how to make magnets move without touching them and even created magnetic paint! In all classes, the children have also started practising for the Breckland School Games. Usually, we select sports teams to compete against other schools but this term it is all happening virtually – which means everyone gets to take part! The children will practise different challenges in their PE lessons over the next couple of months, before their best scores are entered into the competition to see how they compare to other schools.

Parent-Teacher Consultations & Reports

School Meals

From Monday 2nd November, we will be re-introducing hot meals, the children will continue to eat lunch in their classroom bubbles. All pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to Universal Free School Meals. Please book meals via the Myed/Parentmail app. Meals for the Key Stage 2 children (years 3-6) must also be booked and paid for via the App. Some pupils in Key Stage 2 will be eligible for free school meals. Visit Norfolk County Council website to find details about eligibility, and to fill out an application form. We ensure that this information is discretely applied at school. Unfortunately we are not able to offer the sandwich option.


School Photographs
