
















**Updated guidance for parents and carers from the Department of Education** We have updated our guidance for parents and carers on what they need to know about early years providers, schools and colleges during the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. This update provides information on the national restrictions that came into force on 5<sup>th</sup> November, the latest advice for clinically extremely vulnerable children and young people, and advice on the use of face coverings in education settings.

## **Emergency School Closure in Bad Weather**

If the school needs to be closed in the event of an extreme emergency such as:

Blizzard conditions

Heavy snow preventing sufficient staff from being able to get to school Heating and/or lighting problems due to power failure

Lack of water due to burst and/or frozen pipes

then a decision will be made, as soon as possible, and the Emergency School Closure Plan will be activated with the Local Authority (LA).

In such circumstances, please listen to local radio stations, i.e. Radio Norfolk who will broadcast the list of schools closed.

PLEASE NOTE: Unless school is officially closed, then parents have a legal obligation to ensure that their children attend. Non-attendance when the school is officially open is classified as an unauthorised absence.

The decision as to whether the minibus or taxi runs is made by the driver of that vehicle, as the safe conveyance of pupils is his responsibility. In this case, absence would be authorised.
