You will be aware from the media that there are a number of issues surrounding the plans for children to return to school tomorrow. Your child's academy will communicate to you directly arrangements for tomorrow.

In order to open Headteachers need to have the correct number of staff in school to teach the classes. Several of our Headteachers are indicating that staff availability will be reduced and therefore teaching will need to be done remotely for some children. Where this is the case, online or remote learning will be provided to the best of the academy's ability and the school leadership teams will inform parents as promptly as possible. This is fast-moving situation and one that is likely to change through the coming days and weeks.

We recognise that this presents significant challenges for families but we have to be assured that the children coming into school will be always looked after safely.
