



Rowan Class Knowledge Organiser – Kings & Queens (Focus: Ancient Egypt)

Four-Figure Grid References



Using the 2 digits of the easting and the 2 digits of the northing creates a four-figure grid reference. This is the reference for the bottom left corner of a square on the map. This makes it easier to search the map for features.

Remember! Always start with the eastings first (try using the phrase 'along the corridor and up the stairs' to get the right order).


- To locate information on the search results page.

Working Scientifically



In science you carry out practical tasks to find out new things or to test out an idea. These are called **experiments**.

A **fair test** is an experiment where two or more things [**variables**] are compared. One variable is changed and the other is measured. Everything else is kept the same!



The measurements and observations that you record are your **results**. Sometimes you will draw a picture with labels [a **diagram**] or a graph to show your results.

At the end of your experiment you can say what you found out. This is called a **conclusion**.

Things to do at home:

- Share your favourite music as a family and try to use the musical words above to describe what you hear.
- Write your own set of instructions for mummifying a body.
- Look at maps and atlases and practice using grid references to find places. Go for a walk and track this on a map.
- Use a search engine to research a topic that you are interested in. Can you check the information is true by finding it on different websites?
