What have we been doing this week?

Oak Class have been working hard with their writing this week. We have been writing about all the things we can do. We have sounded out our words and tried really hard to form some letters correctly. It looks like our phonics sessions might be working! Well done to Faith for her amazing writing this week!

In Hazel Class, we've started our new English topic learning about captions! We had a photography exhibition in the hall with some funny pictures where we had to match the captions with the picture. We've been continuing our sketching skills in Art, making sure to hold the pencil lightly and with increasing control.

Maple Class enjoyed a village walk this week, using our map skills to follow a route. We were also able to spot the evidence of human and geographical features as we went. A huge thank you to the wonderful volunteers who came with us and made the walk possible.

In Cedar class this week we have been busy writing formal letters in response to our Power of Reading book: The boy at the back of the class. We also learned about skeletons and the three different types which animals can have. We are excited to begin building a model skeleton in

class next week.

Rowan Class started the week with an RE enquiry finding out how religion helps make sense of the world and understand why good and bad things happen. We have also been continuing with our learning about earthquakes and how they affect an area.

Elm Class this week we have been planting our friendship trees using asexual reproduction. We have made our own temporary biome and internal water cycle so that the plants will be self-sufficient. We have also be designing our own graffiti tags. Our music focus is rock music and our chosen song is Living on a Prayer. Please feel free to explore your inner rock soul and join in with your child.

In Sycamore Class, we have been focussing on our shading and sketching skills, creating different tones and hues. Next week, we are going to be making our own mood boards, to plan and design a piece of artwork which gives out a global message to our global neighbours about climate change. We have also been continuing with our newspaper writing skills with a cross-curricular Science focus. We wrote newspaper articles about a dangerous creature and new species found on the school grounds, acting as experts in our field explaining how the new species fits the criteria of a living thing. We explained to readers how the new species found moves, respires, grows, is sensitive to its surroundings and takes in nutrition through its diet.

School Meals

The hot water boiler and extractor fan in the school kitchen have both broken. Owing to this, we are unable to continue to provide hot meals from Wednesday 29th September. Rolls, Wraps and Jacket Potatoes will be the only options available for the next two or three weeks, the salad bar will still be available. Normal service will resume as soon as the replacement and repairs have been completed.

Harvest Festival

We hope to be able to hold an in school Harvest festival later this half term, and would like the children to bring in items for a Harvest collection.
