Marvellous Maths - The magic of counting

Being able to confidently count in different steps really helps pupils in their Maths and is an easy thing you can do at home. Try to encourage your children <u>not</u> to always count in ones (e.g. grouping objects in pairs and counting them in 2s) and <u>not</u> to always start at 0 (e.g. work out 7x4 by knowing 5x4=20 and counting on from there). Attached to this newsletter is a guide to the steps children should be able to count in at different ages. Counting opportunities include: skipping games, counting as you go up and down stairs, awarding points in games, counting while doing an exercise (e.g. star jumps), the fizz buzz game.

As a school, we want to promote a love of reading in every child. As well as daily reading sessions, each class also listens to a class reader. These books are carefully chosen to inspire children, broaden their reading experience and expose them to language they may not read independently.
