

## 1 Minute Maths: Have you downloaded it yet?



Last week we told you about a new app which helps children develop their Maths – it's easy to use and only takes 1 minute!

The 1 Minute Maths App is completely free with no logins or accounts needed. Created by the White Rose Team (whose curriculum we follow in school) it helps your pupils to build greater number confidence and fluency. It's all about targeted practice in engaging, one-minute chunks!

This app will be brilliant for all pupils in EYFS and KS1, but might also help any older children who find Maths more challenging.

### **School Meals**

A cold meal option will be available during the Summer term which will contain: ham, tuna or cheese roll/sandwich with carrot sticks, cucumber dessert of the day and a piece of fruit.

Please note the price of a school meal will increase to £2.47 from 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2022.

## Free school meals

### Is my child eligible?

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 automatically get free school meals if they go to school. It's called universal infant free school meals. You do **not** have to apply to get these meals, **but if you do receive one of the benefits listed below, you should still apply**. This is because it can help raise extra funds for your child's school (called Pupil Premium). This Government funding can help with providing resources that benefit your child directly as well as covering the cost of trips and after school activities

If your child is in Year 3 or above, you must receive one of the following benefits to get free school meals:

- Universal Credit with an annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190

You can apply online for free school meals using your Norfolk Education Online (NEO) account. <u>https://fiso.norfolk.gov.uk/synergy/Enquiries/Citizen/FreeSchoolMeals.aspx/</u>

You can also download and send us an application form. Or collect it from your child's school.

#### Big Norfolk Holiday Fun

Any child aged 5-16 (and 4 year olds in reception classes) can take part in Big Norfolk Festive Holiday Fun activities, but our priority is to promote the scheme to children eligible for free school meals. Families of non-eligible children may have to pay for activities.

Families should visit <u>Big Norfolk Holiday Fun on Active Norfolk</u> to search and book activities.
