This half term, we'll be answering our new question 'What makes the greatest show?'.

We'll be exploring the answer to this question through our History, Art, Music, Computing, PSHE, DT and Science lessons.

Keep on reading to find out what we'll be learning about in these subjects.

In history, we'll be learning about the Gunpowder Plot as well as exploring what our parliament is and what they do:

In Art, we'll be looking at how textiles are used in Art and will be creating our own stage, thinking about how we can use textiles to create the different parts!

In science we'll be learning about materials, thinking about which materials are used in shows and why they are a good material for their purpose.

In DT, we'll be creating our own puppets, using our sewing skills to create the perfect puppet. We'll also be exploring food, thinking about where it comes from and preparing our own dishes!

In Music, we'll be learning how to play the recorder! We'll be exploring which instruments are used in shows, thinking about bands and the music they play.

In Computing, we'll be exploring coding, pictograms and the importance of E-Safety.
