Earrings & PE

We have noticed a number of children have recently had their ears pierced. We would like to remind you that, for school, only small plain studs are permitted.

In PE lessons, we follow the AfPE safe practice guidelines: children with long hair should always have it tied back with a soft band; jewellery including earrings should ideally be removed but, if this is not possible, can be made safe by covering with medical tape. For certain activities (such as swimming and gymnastics) taping does not always offer sufficient protection and, in these situations, the teacher in charge of the lesson will decide what activities the children can safely participate in and may adapt or offer alternatives if they deem something potentially unsafe.

If your child is unable to remove their earrings on PE days, then staff will help them to cover them with tape. Please speak to your child's class teacher if you have any concerns about this.
