SENDCo Information and Support Dyscalculia

What is Dyscalculia?

According to the British Dyslexia Association, Developmental Dyscalculia (DD) is a specific learning disorder that is characterised by impairments in learning basic arithmetic facts, processing numerical magnitude and performing accurate and fluent calculations. This means that an affected pupil will struggle during maths lessons – in particular arithmetic. It is thought that about 25% of the population have some degree of dyscalculia.

Children with dyscalculia often have other developmental disorders such as dyslexia or ADHD. This is usually because of a poor working memory.

Children with dyscalculia often find it difficult to count backwards, need to resort to counting when trying to do arithmetic and have difficulty remembering number patterns despite lots of practice. Equally, they may struggle with estimation and becomes anxious and/or avoidant when challenged in maths lessons.





Sun & Safety!



As the weather becomes warmer and the days sunnier, we would like to encourage everyone to take Sun Safety measures.

We ask that you ensure the children are appropriately dressed and prepared for the heat!

Hats

Although we try to avoid taking children out in direct sunlight for extended periods of time, it is important that while outside they are protecting their heads from the sun.

Please provide your child with a named sun hat/baseball cap each day.

Water bottle

Keeping hydrated in the heat is super important for both health and concentration. Please ensure that children are bringing a named water bottle to school each day.

School staff will encourage children to drink plenty of water and they are able to refill these throughout the school day whenever needed.

Sun Cream

Please ensure you apply sun cream to the children before they arrive to school. Many companies have start to produce a single application sun cream which lasts for 8

hours a day. If they do need to top up their sun cream, then please ensure that the bottle is clearly labelled and the children are able to apply this themselves as adults in

the school are unable to do this for them.

If you have any queries, please speak with your child/ rens class teacher or the office.

class book which is read to the children every day.


