#### Meet the Teacher



My name is Mrs Keeler, and I will be teaching Oak Class in September.

I have been a teacher for 20 years.

I have been at Mundford Primary for 8 years and have taught Years 1 and 2 here. Previously, I worked at Weeting Primary and taught Reception for 8 years and Norton Primary for 4 years, where I taught years 2 and 3.

I live in Mundford and have two boys.

#### **Pupil Information**

- We appreciate it can be an overwhelming process but we need to get all of the necessary information for enrolment;
- Please return all forms as soon as possible if you have not already.

Ensure any allergies and intolerances are reported.

## Transition

- ► Home visits will happen on Monday 10<sup>th</sup>, Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup> July.
- School transition visits will happen on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> July and Friday 14<sup>th</sup> July, and all week commencing Monday 17<sup>th</sup> July.
- ► Children are invited to come to school and stay all day, as they will in September. The doors open between 8.40am -8.50am, and home time is 3.20pm.
- Children can either bring a packed lunch or order a hot meal. If you are in Acorns, please order and pay for lunches in the usual way. If not, we have paper copies and the payments will be added when your child is on the system.

### Start date

First day at school will be Wednesday 6th September 2023.

# Clothing and Possessions

- Please make sure that all belongings are labelled.
- Over the summer holidays encourage your child to practise dressing and undressing independently. Velcro is not a necessity but it really helps build their independence.

# Handy hint!





Something simple to try that not only helps with name recognition but helps your child to put their shoes on the correct feet. All great to encourage independence. Stick a small piece of masking tape into the bottom of each shoe and then write your child's name across the tape with half of it in the left and half in the right. A good way to reinforce that names start with a capital too.

# Attendance and Punctuality

- The school gates open at 8.30am and you go straight through the playground to Oak Class. The door to Oak Class will open at 8.40am and remain open until 8.50am. If you arrive after 8.50am, please report to the school office in the main building;
- You will be greeted by the class teacher at the classroom door;
- Please telephone and inform the school if your child is absent and give the reason;
- All infectious illnesses must be reported (e.g. chicken pox, measles, conjunctivitis);
- If your child becomes ill during the day we will make contact with you and ask you to come and collect or arrange for another person to collect on your behalf. It is therefore crucial that you contact details are up to date.
- Sickness: if your child has a stomach or sickness bug they must remain at home for 48 hours afterwards.
- If your child has a medical condition that requires equipment, for example asthma, please could you make sure we have a spare pump for school.

### Lunches

- ▶ Lunch is 12 1pm.
- For the first few weeks we go to the lunch hall a little earlier to allow all the children to be settled before the other year groups come for their lunch.
- As your child is under 7 years of age you do not have to pay for school dinners, they are free.
- They will be asked in the morning whether they are packed lunch or school dinners.
- The menu is set out at the start of the term and can be found on the school website.
- We are a no nuts school.
- The team will remain in the hall supporting the children and helping them settle, make good choices and eat independently.
- Fruit and milk is also provided for all our children in class.

### Communication

- Half termly class newsletters, emailed home;

- Verbal communication when required for individual children and parents;

# Learning in Reception

- Play is an important part of the daily routine;
- Our curriculum allows children to be inquisitive and tackle things they have never encountered before and equips them to learn to manage uncertainties and assess risk;
- Children take part in focus groups for English and Maths each week with the teacher and this learning will be recorded in books;
- Assessments of the children are carried out through observing them during play;

#### Reading and Phonics

- The children read 1-1 with members of the team each week;
- We also send home 2 books each week for you to read with your child. One will be for enjoyment and one will be for the development of phonics;
- We teach children to read using phonics (letters and sounds) which we teach daily.
