Owls & Goslings

This week, we have been continuing to enjoy 'Where the wild things are' in literacy and using our fabulous phonics knowledge to segment and blend the names of the Wild Things. We also enjoyed baking apple cakes and doing observational drawings of apples linked to our collective worship story 'Adam and Eve'.

Skylarks

This week we wrote our own naughty pet stories which we all tried super hard with! We made clay trees of knowledge linked to our collective worship story of Adam and Eve and thought of things that we find tempting ourselves. In Maths, Year 2 and 3 have been partitioning and the year ones have been hiding numbers and working out the hidden ones using the numbers before and after.

Kestrels

This week in Kestrels, we have been looking at the art and inventions of Leonardo Da Vinci. We looked at his use of colour to denote importance and the emotions which are both present in his art, and which are felt by his audience. In Maths, we have continued our work on place value and we have practised column addition and subtraction. In English we finished our book Farther and explored the characters of the father and son in detail.

Coughs & Colds


Please check & be extra vigilant against these critters!
