Spring Term 2

English

The book that we are looking at this half term is "Stanley's Stick" by John Hegley. We will be sequencing the story, writing captions for the pictures, retelling the story and eventually writing their own versions of the story.

Maths

In maths this half term, we will start by looking at addition and subtraction. This will include building on our number bonds to 10 learning to work out the number bonds to 20. We will then move onto place value at the end of the half term.

Science

In science, we are learning about plants. We will start the half term by planting some sunflowers. We will then label the parts of a plant and will look at what plants need to grow. The children were also interested in finding out about how plants grow without being planted by someone.

Geography

This half term, we will be looking at human and physical features. The children will be labelling pictures to show the different features and will have a walk around the village to see what they can

spot.

Our theme this half term is "Nature and Environment".

Art

The children will learn the primary colours. They will then learn how to mix these to make the secondary colours. At the end of the half term, children will use their mixing skills to make repeat patterns when printing with nature.
