Maths

Science: Forces

How forces apply in our daily lives.

Our core knowledge we need to know about forces is:

- To understand how air resistance and water resistance are forces against motion caused by objects having to move air and water out of their way.
- To understand that friction is a force against motion caused by two surfaces rubbing against each other.
- To understand that some objects require large forces to make them move; gears, pulley and levers can reduce the force needed to make things move

This half-term's project is RE: Tell me what you know about the similarities & differences between Christianity, Hinduism, Muslim and Humanist beliefs. The children can present this in any form they choose and the projects will be shared week beginning 20th May.

Maths: Weekly arithmetic tests sent home for children to practice. Once a fortnight a reasoning problem will be set linked to our current learning. Children who are not confident in recalling times tables are encouraged to continue to play on TT Rockstars regularly.

English: All children are encouraged to read regularly, including reading with an adult and talking about their reading. A fortnightly grammar activity will be sent home, consisting of a question linked to our current learning as well as an optional 'extension challenge' for those children who like to do more.

Children will have a separate homework book for their Maths & English activities and these will be checked on alternate FRIDAYS.
