Spelling at Gooderstone

Over the last few years, we have found that when children are given a list of words to learn for a test, they often spell them correctly in the test but then quickly forget them when writing independently. For this reason, we now focus on teaching spelling rules in weekly sessions. Children are then tested on words that follow these rules, helping them to apply their knowledge more effectively in their writing.

These spelling rules are carefully grouped by year group.

Alongside this, each child also has their own individual list of spellings to work on.

This forms the basis of our Smashing Spelling sessions, which take place three times a week. Children learn a clue for each word, practise it repeatedly, and move on once they are confident. This approach has been very successful in filling any gaps in spelling over the past few years.

In addition, children also take part in Spelling Seed sessions, where they explore the spellings found in their class books. This helps them to see and use words in meaningful contexts.
