Our plan brings together a range of actions across our schools, including:

❁ Biodiversity projects such as rewilding areas of our school grounds, planting pollinator-friendly flowers, and developing our pond habitats.

💡 Energy and water saving initiatives, where children will take an active role in reducing waste and promoting responsible use of resources.

♻️ Waste reduction and recycling drives, including “No Paper Weeks” and “Reuse, Repurpose, Renew” challenges.

🚶 Active travel encouragement, supporting children and families to walk, cycle, or scoot to school where possible.

📖 Curriculum links that embed sustainability in everyday learning — from science and geography to art, design, and philosophy.

🌐 Community partnerships with local and national organisations such as the RSPB, WWF, and The Wildlife Trusts, helping our pupils understand and take action on real-world environmental issues.

A key part of our sustainability journey is rewilding areas of our school grounds to help children connect with nature and learn about the delicate balance of ecosystems. We are very excited to share that our Friends of the School are helping us to raise money for a new standing pond, which will provide fantastic opportunities for pond dipping, outdoor science, and hands-on learning about habitats and wildlife. This space will become a living classroom — a place where curiosity, care, and discovery come together.

Alongside this, we are looking to develop and revitalise the vegetable patches at both schools. If any parents, grandparents, or family members would like to help us revamp these areas or work alongside small groups of children, we would be incredibly grateful. Whether it's digging, planting, or sharing your gardening skills, your support will help bring our sustainability plans to life.

We are also excited to announce our upcoming "Repurpose and Renew Days." During these days, children will learn valuable life skills such as mending, fixing, sewing, and repairing everyday items, encouraging creativity and a sense of responsibility for the things we use. If you have a particular skill in sewing, crafting, or repairing and would be willing to share it with the children, we would love to hear from you. Your time and expertise could inspire a whole new generation of resourceful makers!
